Module Outline & Competencies

Module Description This module develops competency in the following Legal Skills:

The above skills and practice area knowledge, together with, pervasively, Ethics and Professional Conduct, are covered with the aim of developing the competencies required for the second part of the Solicitors Qualification Examination (SQE2).

- 1. Obtain relevant facts from clients in an interview
- 2. Analyse legal problems, identifying and summarising clearly issues relevant to stakeholders
- 3. Undertake efficient and effective practical legal research
- 4. Develop and advise clients or colleagues on relevant options, strategies and solutions for legal problems
- 5. Draft documents which are legally effective and accurately reflect instructions
- 6. Undertake effective spoken and written advocacy
- 7. Identify and communicate potential negotiation solutions to clients' issues
- 8. Communicate clearly and effectively, orally and in writing, with clients and colleagues

Module Content The module content includes textual guidance, audio-visual media demonstrations of specified legal skills, online learning build activities, self-practice tasks, feedback on skills, practice area knowledge revision resources, such as MCQs and flashcards, and an end-of-module summative exam.

Learning activities include:

- 1. Reading on legal skills, and the law and procedure relevant to the practice areas
- 2. Viewing audio-visual media skills demonstrations
- 3. Online interactions developing elements of individual
- 4. Self-practice skills tasks, with individual review and reflection against exemplars and feedback
- 5. Practice skills tasks and feedback

Assessment Learners will sit one end-of-module exam, comprising three assessment stations.
